# Volleyball 2018 Season Recap

Senior Emily Reis moved into the top five Homer setters with 487 assists this season. Emily Rasmussen, just a sophomore, led the team in kills (190) and total blocks (42). In her first year as libero, Katie Baker played great defense picking up 411 digs. Hailey Robertson and Hannah Harris led the team on the service line going 93.5% and 91.2% respectively.

### Words from Coach Johnson:

"Change" and "process" are two key words from the 2018 volleyball season. The team saw a change in line-up with several people taking on new positions. Katie Baker moved from setter to libero; Brooklynn Schmidt moved from libero to outside hitter; Emily Reis moved from a part-time setter in a 6-2 offense to our only setter running a 5-1 offense. Add in Erin Georgesen in the middle and Hailey Robertson as a serving specialist, two seniors who did not play last year, along with a new head coach, and you've got major change. It was important from the outset that the team work extra hard on the court and even harder off the court to keep a positive mindset and build a culture of teamwork. The girls learned to trust the process - the training, both physical and mental - and by the end of the season, they saw the process pay off with an 8game win streak and intense play. The Lady Knights did exactly what a coach hopes, which is to peak at the end of our season. We'll will sorely miss our five seniors - Emily, Karrena, Erin, Hailey, and Shayla. The underclassmen will have to work hard in the offseason and stay competitive (track helps!) in order to pick up where we left off at the end of 2018. ## Homer Football Season Recap by Alex Huerta

The Homer Knights football team ended the season with a 1-7 record. The player that led the team with the most passing yards is Jacob Huerta. Jacob had 32 completed passes out of 97 attempts and had 606 passing yards, and he had an average of 18.9 yards per a completion. Caleb Kearnes was second with 8 completed passes out of 16 and had 69 passing yards, with an average of 8.6 yards per a completion. The players with the most rushing yards were Jacob Huerta and Landon Gilster. Jacob Huerta had 107 carries with 443 yards and his average yards per a carry was 4.1. As for Landon Gilster he had 48 carries with 271 yards and his average yards per a carry was 5.6. The two leading players with the most receiving yards were Landon Gilster and Alex Huerta. Landon had 11 receptions and 311 receiving yards and averaged 28.3 yards per catch. Alex Huerta had 13 receptions and 242 receiving yards and averaged 18.6 yards per catch. The two players that led the defense with the most tackles were Alex and Jacob Huerta. Jacob had 45 solo tackles and 35 assists for a total of 80 tackles. Alex had 22 solo tackles and had 29 assists for a total of 51 tackles.

Head football coach Shawn Spurrell commented on the season:

"As expected this year's football team was a fun one to coach. We struggled through difficult times together and grew individually as a result. Sometimes you get the closest with the group of guys that you experience the most adversity with, and that can definitely be said about this year's squad. As down as we were about losing so many players to injury, the guys continued to grow as a team and as football players. It was hard for all of us to walk off that football field for the last time. I thought they were going to have to ask us to leave, because it was emotional saying goodbye to the seniors. We were all pretty happy that were able to walk off that field with a win."

### ACCOUNT MANAGEMENT - STUDENTS

- Log into your account.
- 2. Select Manage Students under Manage Account.
- 3. Enter student Last Name and Family or Student ID#.
- 4. Select Add Student(s).
- 5. Repeat steps 2-4 to add additional students.





### ACCOUNT MANAGEMENT PAYMENT INFORMATION

# A Message from Our Elementary Principal...



With the winter season quickly approaching, the elementary staff and I would like to wish everyone the warmest wishes for the holidays. We hope this time is relaxing, rejuvenating, and safe. We appreciate all that the parents and community do for our students and know that this is

a special time to enjoy with your families and friends.

Please remember the academic school day begins at 8:00 a.m. and ends at 3:25 p.m. Students who frequently arrive late or leave early are missing out on valuable instructional time. We ask that parents limit phone calls requesting a change in your child's dismissal. Please send a note in the morning when there is a change for the day in dismissal and give details regarding transportation or who is picking your child up.

Often this is the time of year where childhood illnesses are more prevalent in schools. Please refrain from sending your son/daughter to school with a low-grade temperature (even if medicated), complaints of a sore throat, or undiagnosed skin conditions. While your child may seem fine after medication, it is often the case they end up in the nurse's office and sent home. A written excuse or phone call to the school secretary is a requirement for all absences.

Soon it will be winter break. During this time, it is important that students continue reading, writing, and practicing their math facts. Make learning fun by tying it into your daily routine, so students understand the importance of education.

As we look forward to the second half of the school year, we anticipate the same enthusiasm as the first semester. With the arrival of winter and the cold weather, students need to dress appropriately for these weather conditions and are mindful of the dress code. School cancellations will be broadcast on local television stations and through the School Reach phone system.
